HOW TO ACCESS **EJA** ONLINE

The **European Journal of Anaesthesiology (EJA)** is one of the most valuable resources available for those working in anaesthesiology or intensive care and is now published online via the Cambridge Journals Online service (CJO), making it even more useful and usable.

The scope and purpose of **EJA**, which is to publish original work of high scientific quality, remains unchanged. What has changed, however, is that the online format provides a much enhanced service.

What can Cambridge Journals Online offer?

Cambridge Journals Online (CJO) provides access to over 190 Cambridge Journals, covering some of the world's best scholarship in a wide range of subject areas.

Features include:

- Easy access: access control for institutions by IP addresses or domain
- Personalization: users can modify the service to suit their own needs, creating direct links to articles and storing previous searches
- Superior searching facility: provides powerful capabilities for searching by title, by subject, by keyword(s), within a particular title, a range of journals, or across the entire CJO service
- **FREE** access to all tables of contents and article abstracts

All ESA members have electronic access to **EJA** via the CJO service. This means that you are able to print and download the full text of articles, no matter where you are.

How to access EJA online on Cambridge Journals Online

Accessing **EJA** on Cambridge Journals Online couldn't be easier, as a registered member of the ESA, simply follow the instructions given below and you'll soon be able to access the journal articles.

- Visit the Cambridge Journals Online site at www.journals.cambridge.org
- Log onto CJO using your ESA username and password as provided for **Members Gate** on the ESA website (www.euroanesthesia.org)
- You should now be able to access the full text and pdf articles for **EJA** as defined by your ESA membership
